V A Q Bubba teaches Forrest about the many methods to prepare shrimp-paraphrasing, "thays barbeque, boiled, baked, sautéed, fried, then kabobs, Creole, gumbo lemon, coconut, soup, stew, salad or sandwich". In quilt worlds there would be crib quilts, wall quilts, lap or bed quilts; antique, challenge, child or miniature quilts, two color, string, embellished or painted quilts- all this before we talk about color! The quilt blocks from the selection box are virtually as unlimited as the preparation of Bubba's shrimp dishes.

Forrest's home city, Savannah, could be considered one master quilt. Downtown Savannah is made up of wards and squares as designed by James Oglethorpe. There were 24 original squares all in grid fashion. A picture from aerial photography shows a nice neat row of blocks and cornerstones. Considering Forrest's imagination, one could easily see a gigantic *turning twenty* or modified *nine patch*. Some squares are even named, consider (W)right square, Liberty square and Green square. Maybe Oglethorpe was a quilter too? With his simple approach to all things life, I suspect that Forrest could have been a phenomenal quilter. When his love, Jenny, asked him "who you gonna be", he replied "aren't I gonna be me"? As for me, I'm "gonna" be a quilter.
