There has been a lot of enthusiasm again this year for the NICU quilts and it is very much appreciated. Several groups have undertaken this as a special project, some use it as a beginning project to teach new quilters, and some like the idea of using fabrics from their stash and project leftovers, all for a good cause.

We have collected 129 NICU quilts this year through September and the hospital can use approximately 200 per year. With only 3 months remaining, let's all try to make at least one or two before we get too distracted by the upcoming holiday season.

The quilts should be 17" x 25" and suitable for the hospital laundry. Pastel colors are preferred and also holiday designs, especially Christmas (TMH likes to have a Christmas quilt for each baby during the holiday season). Do not use embellishments such as buttons since these quilts are cleaned in the hospital laundry which is not as gentle as we are used to.

Several design suggestions are posted on the QU web site in the Activities and Projects section. Click on 'baby quilts' in the Activities and Projects section and then just click on the teddy bear! There's also a simple formula on the last page of the web patterns.

Finished quilts can be delivered at any QU meeting to Lorna Fisher or Wendy Stone. Thank you for your generosity!!!

 Pollock had quilts in the show. Janet


