Pillowcase Challenge

Wanted: 500 pillowcases by October's meeting

Needed: Great participation from every guild member!

Challenge 1:

This is a very worthwhile undertaking and will benefit two deserving groups. Group one members are our armed service personnel who are in VA spinal cord injury units. Those hospitals in Miami, Tampa, and Augusta are closest to us and will benefit from our efforts. Cases suitable for men and



women to offer a little piece of home are needed. Males out number the women in the units so please think and select masculine prints/colors.

Challenge 2:


The second group is ConKerr Cancer started by a mother whose son had cancer. She made a special pillowcase each time he had to go into the hospital and realized every child suffering from cancer would enjoy such a special case. Again, there are boys and girls being treated and deserving of something special. This organization is widespread and members have produced well over 300,000 cases! Unfortunately, alt-

hough this is a large number, cancer cases are more numerous.

Let's dig into our stashes or collections, if you prefer that term, and sew up some happiness!!!



Instructions for making a pillowcase with a finished size of 20X30 inches to fit a standard size pillow:

Step 1: Cut a 9" piece of fabric across the width of fabric. Remove selvages.

Step 2: Cut a 27" piece of another fabric across the width. Remove Selvages.

Step 3: Sew the 9" and 27" pieces together (1/4" seem) along the width of the fabric. Press seams toward the 9" fabric. (Trim if necessary to make fabrics same width.)

Step 4: Fold fabric in half with **right side out**. Match seams where the two fabrics were sewn. Sew from the top edge of the 9" strip down to the end of the 27" strip. Then sew the bottom edge of the 27" strip. Turn the case inside out. Press along both sewn seams to smooth and ready the case for the second seaming.

Step5: With right sides together sew from the top of the case along the side encasing the seam, then sew the bottom seam, so no raw edge shows except where the two fabrics where joined originally. Turn case inside out so right side of fabric shows.

Step 6: Press top edge of 9" fabric under ½", fold the 9" fabric in, so that it will cover the raw seam. Pin in place. Then top stich the hem.

You may also add a decorative stich if you wish to do so.

Your case is complete!

Iron and fold it, and place in a gallon size Ziploc plastic bag. Please indicate if the case is for a veteran or child.
