Activities Committees:

Door Prizes (5) — Door prizes are awarded during each monthly Guild meeting to those who wear a hand-made pieced name tag and have put their name in the basket. The chair person or co-chairs are responsible for selection of door prize gifts, submission of names during the social half hour of each guild meeting and drawing of names during the Door Prize segment of the business meeting. This is a fun position that provides an opportunity to meet many of the members.

Show and Tell (5) – During every monthly Guild meeting we provide an opportunity for members to show their work. This chairperson brings out the step ladders before the meeting and helps hold up the quilts being shown. This person also provides assistance, when needed, during programs that involve trunk shows. This is a fun simple job that would be ideal for co-chairs but does require a moderate level of mobility to go up and down the ladders and hold quilts up.

Trip Coordinator (3) – Every year the guild sponsors a bus trip to the Jacksonville Quilt Show. This person is responsible for planning, making arrangements, and executing this trip. In addition, other trips can be arranged depending on member interest. These can be one-day quilt show or shop hops or even overnight trips.

Sit'n Stitch Coordinator (5) – The role of the Sit-n-Stitch coordinator is to greet new members and explain the functions of a Sit-n-Stitch group. She should be somewhat familiar with each existing group and how they function, maintain a list of current groups with contact persons, meeting dates and times, and locations.

Helping Hands (3/1) – This chairperson serves as a resource for members who may have questions about a quilt technique or sewing process. She offers advice or help when a member needs to know "how to ...". The combination rating for this role is because while it is an easy, fun position, it does require some knowledge, either personal or at least of resources for where to find an answer.

A committee comprised of Linda Koestel, Pat Lester, and Artha Callinan met on Friday, January 4th, to count the votes cast by members of the Sunshine State Quilters Association on the future of the Association. After the count was done, the committee contacted Sarah Hough (Membership) to tell her the outcome of the vote. I am sorry to report that out of a total of 152 members, we only received a total of 62 votes: 43 to disband and 19 not to disband. We are now working on the process of disbanding the organization.
