President's Message Hints from "Heloise" Dorothy

Dear Dorothy

My quilt is finished but I still see the pencil marks in several places. How can I safely remove them?

Try using an art gum eraser or better yet, the eraser that is attached to the pencil that was used to create the marks. If that doesn't work, the simple solution is really a solution. Courtesy of one of our expert quilters, Larayne Cunningham. This mixture will remove any leftover pencil mark on fabric.

Mix 1/2 cup water, 3/4 cup rubbing alcohol and 7-8 drops of dish detergent in a spray bottle. Spritz the area and rub gently with your fingernail. Repeat as necessary.

Hint: When you prick your finger and end up with a blood stain on your quilt, the best remover is your on saliva. Digestive enzymes in your saliva will breakdown the protein in your blood. So spit, rinse and repeat!
