President's Message Quilt Tips

A New Perspective

To get the perspective of distance on a quilt plan, view it through a door peephole insert from the hardware store. This inexpensive gadget can help you "read" how fabrics will look from a distance.

A Washing Caution

Avoid using fabric softener in the washer or dryer when you prewash fabrics that you later intend to fuse. Fusible web will not adhere properly to fabrics treated with fabric softener.

Appliqué Storage

A great way to store small pieces cut for appliqué is on layers of flannel-backed vinyl. Cut a vinyl tablecloth in pieces the right size for a pizza box or other storage container. Place appliqués on the flannel side of the squares and stack them up.

Appliqué Accident

If you have accidentally fused an appliqué in the wrong place, use a fabric softener dryer sheet as a pressing cloth to loosen the web so you can remove the appliqué to reposition it.

Avoid the Fuzz

When changing thread on your sewing machine, cut the thread at the spool, and pull the thread out toward the needle. This will avoid fuzzing up the tension disks and will actually "floss" the tension mechanism at the same time.

Clean and Heal

Use a dry, nylon kitchen scrubby to clean you cutting mat. It will clean away all the lint and threads and help heal the mat as well.

She immediately said she liked the idea and would be interested in publishing our story. After a lot of emails with questions and answers, Barbara assigned us a staff writer and offered an additional \$50 prize to the first place winner.

Our guild's story and the photo with instructions will be published. At this point in our correspondence, I do not know how much room we will be given in the magazine. So I can not say if 2nd and 3rd will be included. Hopefully, at a minimum, there will be a group photo of the other winners.

I hope our Challenge quilters are as excited as Martha Tilden and I are over our guild being in a national quilting publication.

Votes will be counted and winners announced.

INFO FOR CHALLENGE QUILT MAKERS

- 1. Bring your finished ROAD TO FLORIDA quilts to the Aug. 8 meeting by 6pm for hanging and signing photo release forms for THE QUILTING QUARTERLY article.
 - 2. Bring instructions for 12" block or email to gator1984@comcast.net
- 3. Pin a 3" x 5" paper to front of quilt with the quilt title and a brief description of your design process and thinking for voters to read. DO NOT include your name on front of quilt (your name should be on a label on back of quilt, however)
 - 4. Be prepared to briefly describe your quilt after voting is completed.
- 5. Take your quilt home after the meeting and turn it in at the Museum of Florida History, 10am to noon, August 24. Be sure that your quilt has a label and 4" hanging sleeve on back of quilt.
- 6. If you can't be at the meeting, please ask a fellow quilter, friend or family member to bring your quilt for you.

Small/Medium/Long-arm Machine Quilter's group

This group is geared towards:

- "Small-arm guilters" domestic sewing machines on a frame.
- "Mid-arm quilters" those in the 14" 16" range, a more industrial machine; for this group, this applies more to the ones on a frame, but can also apply to the growing crop of sit-down mid-arms. And

"Long-arm quilters" - the big ones that we more characteristically think of, in the 18" to 30" in range, and which sit on a frame.

The group is open to both (1) machine and/or frame owners; and (2) those who are interested in acquiring the machine/frames.

The date, time, and location for the next meeting is scheduled for *Wednesday July 31st*, from 7:00-8:30pm, at Linda Brooks home (see directory for address). Meetings typically will be at a member's house so we can see their set-up. As such meeting dates and times will be subject to the hostess' schedule. It is likely that the August meeting will be on a Saturday, for this reason. There also may be road-trips to view equipment, perhaps take classes, or as the group sees fit.
