Hints from "Heloise" Dorothy

Q: I accidentally cut a hole in my quilt. How can I repair it?

A: Do not despair. The quilt top is not totally lost. A tiny snip could be closed with a few hand stitches of matching thread if a solid color. If a print, take a small piece of matching fabric and appliqué over the hole. Remove as much bulk as possible on the back and press to help the patch to lie flat.

Another option is to hand embroider a design over the hole. This is a form of embellishment and can be spread through out the quilt. No one will know you were trying to cover a mishap.

Prevention: Always make sure the quilt is flat and smooth before sniping threads. Dorothy Barr

Guild Opportunities

As President-Elect for 2014, I am in the process of lining up officers and committee chairs for next year and there are still some great openings for someone to step up and give back to this wonderful organization. Please keep in mind that all of these roles have a notebook that will guide you. These notebooks are updated and passed along so that you will know what your responsibilities are, but also allows you the freedom to make the role what you think it should be. The positions still available are as follows:

<u>Hospitality</u> – This is a great opportunity for a team or group. It involves set up and clean up in the kitchen each month and coordination of potluck suppers. This does not require that you spend all your time before meetings stuck in the kitchen, but someone does need to get to the meeting early and monitor the supplies during the social half-hour.

<u>Door Prize</u> - The role of the Door Prize Chairperson is to coordinate the selection of door prize gifts, submission of names during the social half hour of each guild meeting and drawing of names during the Door Prize segment of the business meeting. This is a fun position and can be accomplished in a variety of ways that are only limited to the Chairperson's imagination. There is a budget for this and would be great fun for a team.

<u>Trip Coordinator</u> - The role of the Trip Coordinator is to plan and execute bus trips for Guild members. These may be a one day trip to a quilt show or a shop hop or even an overnight trip to an out of town venue that could involve airfare and lodging. Currently, the Jax Quilt Show one-day bus trip is the only event being planned each year.

<u>Opportunity Quilt Chair for 2015 Museum Show</u> – There are extensive notes and a detailed timeline for this role and while it seems like a long way off, the current notebook indicates that planning should begin in September of this year for 2015!. The show theme for 2015 is 'For every quilt there is a season'. While one person is designated as the 'chairperson', this is a great project for a team or group approach. Keep in mind, that members throughout the guild volunteer to help.

Síť N'Stítch News: Small/Medíum/Long-arm Machíne Quílter's group

This new group had its introductory meeting on June 25th. The group is geared towards:

- "Small-arm quilters" domestic sewing machines on a frame.
- "Mid-arm quilters" -- those in the 14" 16" range, a more industrial machine; for this group, this applies more to the ones on a frame, but can also apply to the growing crop of sit-down mid-arms. And

• "Long-arm quilters" -- the big ones that we more characteristically think of, in the 18" to 30" in range, and which sit on a frame.

The group is open to both (1) machine and/or frame owners; and (2) those who are interested in acquiring the machine/frames.

Six Guild-members attended, and the conversation went full steam, discussing various frames and machine set-ups, practicing on quilt sandwiches, tension, frame-leaders, rulers, fabric sources, batting, and the like. Photos were shared of some of the attendees' set-ups, with an on-site tour of hostess' frame and machine.

The date, time, and location for the next meeting was set as **Wednesday July 31st**, from **7:00-8:30pm**, at Linda Brooks home (see directory for address). Meetings typically will be at a member's house so we can see their set-up. As such meeting dates and times will be subject to the hostess' schedule. It is likely that the August meeting will be on a Saturday, for this reason. There also may be road-trips to view equipment, perhaps take classes, or as the group sees fit. E-mail reminders of the date/time/location will be sent out in advance.
