January Block of the Month

Rail Fence Block

QU will continue with the red, white, and blue theme again for 2024. I plan on keeping these blocks simple throughout the year.

I will have a few printed patterns at the meeting for those without internet.

Finished Block: 12" square

Materials:


Yardages and cutting instructions are based on 42" of usable fabric width.


One 2 ½" x 30" strip each of red, white, and blue fabrics.


<u>Assemble Block</u>:


Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

- 1. Referring to Diagram 1 and aligning long edges, sew together the solid 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" strips to make a strip set. Press seams in one direction. The strip set should be 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" including seam allowances.
- 2. Cut strip set into four 6 1/2" squares (Diagram 2).
- 3. Referring to Diagram 3, sew together squares in pairs. Press seams open. Join pairs to make a Rail Fence block. Press seam in one direction. The block should be $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " square including seam allowances.

Retired U.S. Army Major Leigh C. Fairbank, III of Tallahassee was awarded a Quilt of Valor at his home on November 18, 2023. Major Fairbank served 22.5 years in the Army after graduating from West Point. He saw action in Viet Nam and earned numerous medals including 4 Purple Hearts, 2 Silver Stars, and 3 Bronze Stars for Valor. His quilt was made by Roberta G. and quilted by Sarah P. A Quilt of Valor was awarded to retired U.S. Navy Captain Morris Steen at his home on November 21, 2023 in Greenville, Florida.
