February Block of the Month

Pinwheel Star

This block can be found at:

Cut the fabrics:

From white:

- ❖ 1 7 1/4" square, cutting it diagonally twice in an x for a total of 4 large triangles
- 1 4 1/4" square, cutting it diagonally twice in an x for total of 4 small triangles (Note: These are the blue checked triangles in the picture above.)
- ❖ 2 3 7/8" square, cutting each in half diagonally for a total of 4 medium triangles
- ❖ 4-3½" squares (Note: in the picture above, these are the four red corners.)

From red:

- ❖ 1 4 1/4" square, cutting it diagonally twice in an x for a total of 4 small triangles From blue:
- ❖ 4 3 7/8" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for a total of 8 medium triangles Assemble the block:
- 1. Sew together one small red triangle and one small white triangle along short sides. (Note: The "small white triangles" are the blue checked triangles in the picture above.) Then join the long side of a medium white triangle to a red and white triangle set. Repeat to make a total of four units.
- 2. Sew together units in pairs. Press seam allowances in opposite directions. Then join the pairs to make the center unit.
- 3. Sew the long side of a medium blue triangle to one short side of a large white triangle. Repeat with a second medium blue triangle on the other short side of the large white triangle to make flying geese unit. Unit should measure $3 \frac{1}{2} \times 6 \frac{1}{2}$, including seam allowances. Repeat to make total of 4 flying geese units.
- 4. Lay out pieces for one block in horizontal rows. Sew together the pieces in each row. Then join the rows to make the block.

QU Show TEAM Boutique Update

The team has been busy little elves over the holidays. Our goal is to use as much of the fabulous donated fabric that QU has received (and that has been graciously stored at Ann's home). With this goal in mind, a lot of time and energy has been spent just going through all the various types and sizes of donated fabrics (cottons, linen, silk, upholstery etc.) and making a determination on its best use for the boutique. The team is also testing/editing patterns and creating sample boutique items. Once the patterns are ready and kits assembled for distribution, you should start seeing kits at the February meeting.

HOW CAN YOU HELP! QU members are being asked to take a kit (includes fabric and pattern), then create and return the item no later than the August meeting. For those who are unable to attend the meetings to grab a kit, patterns will also be available online for you to make at home (and assist you in reducing your own fabric stash).

Remember, it's **your** quilt show, and we need **your** help in making the boutique successful to offset show related expenses.

Below is the list of boutique items we currently plan to offer for sale at the QU Show. The list has been vetted through many people experienced in this type of project. The team will re-evaluate and determine if additional items are needed. Our biggest obstacle is the limited space available at the show allocated for the boutique.

Boutique Items: Soup bowl cozy (small & large) * Cosmetic bag (small and large) * Drawstring backpacks * Dog collar scarf (Small/med/large) * Key Caddies * Christmas ornaments (folded star) * Patchwork & Infinity scarfs * Journal covers with books * Bookmarks (4" x 4" squares) * Fat Quarter packages * 5" squares (20 per bag)

Mariner's Compass Workshop (1-day)

Friday March 15th AND/OR Saturday March 16, 2024 10 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.



Our 6-hour workshop is an introduction/refresher to foundation paper piecing. We will construct 2 different star/compass designs starting with a very elementary one: a 7"-4 or 8 pointed star and finish off with a 14" wide X 19" high 24-point oval. It's all the same

This class provides a safe environment to learn foundation paper piecing, no tiny pieces. You will also learn to

calculate how to cut fabric pieces that FIT the different sections. You don't have to guess or end up with sections that are all bias edge.

https://QuiltTallahassee.com.



they need revision, please send very specific substitute language, etc. to Jennifer Darnell, our 2024 Web Coordinator.




Chrome

- 1. Go to Settings
- 2. At the bottom, click on Advanced
- 3. Under Privacy and Security, click on Clear Browsing Data
- 4. Check the box for Cached Images and Files
- 5. Click on Clear Data



Firefox


- Click on the menu in the top right corner (it's the three horizontal lines symbol).
- 2. Then click Preferences
- Choose Privacy and Security in the left sidebar menu.
- Finally, click Clear Now next to Cached Web Content




Safari

In the Safari browser, find and click on Develop in your menu, then click on Empty Caches. If you have a keyboard, you can simply use the Option-Command E shortcut.

If for some reason you don't see Develop in your menu, you'll need to enable it first. Click on Preferences, then Advanced, then check Show Develop Menu in Menu Bar.





Edge

- Click on the 3 horizontal dots in the upper right corner of the browser to see more menu options
- 2. Then click on Settings
- Click the Choose What to Clear button under Clear Browsing Data
- 4. Check the box for Cached Data and Files
- 5. Select Clear
