President's Message – Triumph of the Ordinary

Weren't we amazed at our January meeting with happy tables and admiring faces as our superb quilter Linda O revealed how she makes her stunning quilts. See the photos on the website for a good review. Amazingly, Linda would say, "These really aren't that complicated" and then go on to explain her technique. She turns the ordinary to exquisite. How she spoke of fabric color as "close enough" was a liberating thought.



Ever wonder how one can get so much done in a day? I loved those ordinary days in the work world. Things chugged along smoothly, and I could write "good day" in my planner and prep easily for the next day. Much is written about ordinary living. March Block of the Month

The Anvil

Preparing the pieces

Start by cutting the Color 1 3-7/8" x 15-1/2" strip into four 3-7/8"squares. Stack the squares and cut them once on diagonal to make eight half-square triangles.

Then cut Color 2 3-7/8" x 15-1/2" strip into four 3-7/8" squares.



Stack the squares and cut them once on diagonal to make eight half-square triangles.

Now cut the Color 2 3-1/2" x 28" strip into eight 3-1/2" squares. Using 1/4" seam, sew pairs of Color 1/Color 2 half-square triangles to make eight half-square units. These should measure 3-1/2".

Now layout all the units as shown in picture. Sew four horizontal rows pressing seams in alternating directions by row. Join rows to complete. Block should measure 12-1/2".

- Quilts that were too big for previous QU shows (King- and Queen-size quilts are welcome in 2024 — and will be too big for LeMoyne in 2025 — this year is their moment to shine!)
- Quilts that you've made in the past that were too many for the LeMoyne show (Your show committee hopes you'll enter THREE quilts AND a Challenge quilt this year!)
- Quilts that are imperfect (Remember: this is not a juried show; you might see a flaw where show visitors would see a delightful creation!)

The team has been busy over the holidays. Our goal is to use as much of the fabulous donated fabric that QU has received (and that has been graciously stored at Ann's home). With this goal in mind, a lot of time and energy has been spent going through all the various types and sizes of donated fabrics (cottons, linen, silk, upholstery, etc.) and making a determination on its best use for the boutique. The



team has been testing/editing patterns and creating samples, and kits have been assembled for distribution at the February meeting. We are trying to have a unique selection of items that would appeal to different age groups, since there will also be a silent auction, quilts, and baskets for attendees to consider purchasing.

HOW CAN YOU HELP! QU members are being asked to pick up kit(s) (which include fabric, materials, and pattern), to create and return no later than the July meeting. You only need to supply thread and your time. You are also welcome to grab from your stash and make any items. For those who are unable to attend the meetings: patterns/instructions are also available online for you to make at home (and assist you in reducing your own fabric stash). backpacks * Dog bandanas (small/med/large/teeny tiny) * Key Caddies (square and rectangle)* Patchwork & Infinity scarves * Journal covers * Bookmarks.

P.S. While busy creating awesome items for the boutique, consider trying to add regular movement breaks into your life, ideally 5 minutes every half hour. Check out the interesting information about the Body Electric Challenge on NPR.org. Mariner's Compass Workshop (1-day)

Friday March 15th AND/OR Saturday March 16, 2024

10 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.



Our 6-hour workshop is an introduction/refresher to foundation paper piecing. We will construct 2 different star/compass designs starting with a very elementary one: a 7" 4- or 8-pointed star and finish off with a 14" wide X 19" high 24-point oval. It's all the same

techniques!

This class provides a safe environment to learn foundation paper piecing, no tiny pieces. You will also learn to

calculate how to cut fabric pieces that FIT the different sections. You don't have to guess or end up with sections that are all bias edge.

Class fee: \$30 which includes all patterns and instructions.

QU Show Silent Auction

Now is the time to come to the aid of the QU Silent Auction!!!!!!. The Silent Auction was traditionally a top money-making activity at the Guild's shows when they were held at the Museum of Florida History. We need that tradition to continue!

Please think about donating items to the Silent Auction that will take place at the Quilt Show from August 31 through September 2, 2024. Donations can include any sewn or quilted item such as quilts, wall hangings, bags*, purses, potholders, place mats, table runners, necklaces, ragdolls, or such. *PLEASE NOTE: The boutique will be selling cosmetic-size bags. Please don't compete with those. You are invited to donate larger bags.

The participant who brings in the most money for a single donated item will receive their next year's QU dues (2025) gratis. Please note that the award is for a single entry and does not include the total of an individual's multiple entries. However, we do encourage multiple entries if you so desire. The Sit N Stitch group that brings in the most money for a group donation will receive a \$20 gift certificate, given to the contact person named in the directory, to use at one of your upcoming Sit N Stitch

sessions.

Quilts should have a label on the back with the quilter's name, a title for the item, and the year completed. The title will be published in the Silent Auction Guidelines given to bidders at the show. It would be helpful to also provide the size (in length and width) of a donated quilt. You can optionally set a minimum bid amount for each of your items — you will get an item back at the end of the show if the minimum for it is not met by a bidder.

I will be accepting Silent Auction donations at every QU meeting. If you are unable to bring your item, I am very happy to meet up with you to get your donation.
