

How to Make an Infinity Scarf

What you will need: 1 yd of 60" wide fabric and standard sewing supplies

Step 1: Cut your fabric in a rectangle that measures 30" x 58. If you are using a lightweight fabric that tends to fray make sure that you use a new sharp needle size 60/8 or 70/10. Reduce your stitch size to prevent puckering. If you are using quilt weight cotton you can sew as usual. If you use a polyester fabric that frays easily be careful with needle choice and stitch length.

Step 2: Fold the fabric right sides together and long ways.

Step 3: Sew the long edges together to make a long tube. Use a 1/2" seam allowance. Press the seam open.

Step 4: Turn the tube right side out and press. If you are using a polyester fabric be sure to use a press cloth or set your iron on a low temperature.

Step 5: Lay the tube out and fold one end over so that there is a twist in the center of the scarf. Take the short ends and pin them so that they are right sides together. Take care to peel one end back so that the right sides are together and the twist remains in the center of the scarf. Match up the seams before sewing.

Step 6: Sew the short ends of the scarf together using 1/2" seam allowance leaving a 4" gap for turning.

Step 7: Turn the scarf right side out through the opening.

Step 8: Close the opening using ladder stitch and you have finished your infinity scarf. The next thing to do is wear your beautiful creation!
