President's Message – A Quilt Remembered

Allow me to reflect on a trip of a lifetime, 1,376 miles of the perimeter of Florida, through sun, rains, highways, bridges, Key West, the Tamiami Trail, family visits, museums, and my very favorite, "Old Florida." We planned this journey around the Seaside Piecemakers Quilt Show in Melbourne titled "The Artistry of Quilts," and I was astounded by the 350 quilts on display and the incredible exhibit by Kestral Michaud's "imaginative realism." She is an engaging, talented, and friendly person, and her creations are unique. I loved every



minute of admiring all the rows of quilts, reading the descriptions, and speaking with the Seaside quilters. Florida quilters are truly gifted. (See page 3 for more pictures from the quilt show!)

Which leads me to my title. What is a "quilt remembered"? What quilts do we gravitate toward, take in, stay longer viewing, photograph, observe, analyze, and remember? Was it the theme, or the perfect points, the colors, fabric, or the sheer blast of incredulity upon seeing a Best of Show, or the quilt that is a post-illness creation of thanksgiving and resolve? I chose a floral explosion as my favorite for technique, and a holocaust remembrance quilt in honor of the families who perished. To remember a quilt is to appreciate, celebrate, and protect its living history.

March is bringing us out of our houses for revival and inspiration. Your outdoor skills (gardening, camping, hiking, neighborhood rounds) benefit by Florida's early spring. What we glean outside we bring to our quilt creations, and lo and behold another quilt is in the works! We're not competing with anyone, but we are drawing on our own desire to leave that legacy, imagining the finished product and its passage through time. Our upcoming Kaleidoscope of Color Quilt Show needs your entry, your demonstrations, your creative power! I look forward to being as astonished at the Fairgrounds this Labor Day as I was in Melbourne. People are going to be educated and amazed by our fine exhibits, our vendors to enjoy good sales, and our silent auction and

boutique to receive their due price. It's all worth it, a kaleidoscope of color with many quilts remembered. Prepare for the exposition, I mean, explosion!

April Block of the Month

The North Wind Block

This block can be found at:

Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block

Color 1....Cut one 8 7/8" square and one 4 7/8" \times 14 5/8" strip.

Color 2....Cut one 8 7/8" square and one 4 7/8" x 14 5/8" strip.

Stack large squares together and cut once on the diagonal.


Then stack and cut strips into three 4 7/8" squares. Now cut these once on the diagonal.

Sew together one light and one dark triangle. Please refer to the link above for further information if needed.

Notes from Philanthropy Chairs - Evelyn Gonzales and Marion Millet (with Ann Gaber assisting)

At the March meeting, we will be bringing quilt kits for tops to be pieced in traditional fashion. There will also be a sign-up sheet for dates and times to come to Ann's house to make more kits. This is a big push to clear much of our current donations for charity quilts.

Also at the March meeting, we will have components for quilt sandwiches to be quilted. Some may be best done on a long-arm or free-style machine. So, any of you with this type of machine, please consider taking a bundle. However, some will be small enough to be manageable on a standard machine. The quilting does not need to be fancy - sturdy is best!

There will also be kits available for strip quilts, also known as quilt-as-you-go quilts. These are easy to complete on a standard sewing machine.

If you would like to make a charity quilt of your own design, you can gather some or all of the materials you need from donated fabrics available from our philanthropy team.

OU Show Silent Auction

I can no longer remain "silent". I must shout out with enthusiasm about the Silent Auction and the donations I already received. We have some beautiful quilts donated for the Silent Auction which will yield good proceeds for QU but we need many more items. I was fortunate to attend the Frayed Edges Sit N Stitch group and see the projects they are working on for the Silent Auction. I am shouting out the need for other Sit and Stitch groups to think about working on auction items. Remember the donations can include any sewn or quilted item such as quilts, wall hangings, purses, place mats, table runners, necklaces, ragdolls or such.

PLEASE NOTE: The boutique will be selling cosmetic-size bags, book covers, pet collars and backpacks so keep that in mind as we do not want to compete with the boutique.

As a reminder, the participant who brings in the most money for a single donated item will receive their next year's QU dues (2025) gratis. Please note that the award is for a single entry and does not include the total of an individual's multiple entries. However,

we do encourage multiple entries if you so desire. The Sit N Stitch group that brings in the most money for a group donation will receive a \$20 gift certificate, given to the contact person named in the directory, to use at one of your upcoming Sit N Stitch sessions.

Quilts should have a label on the back with the quilter's name, a title for the item, and the year completed. The title will be published in the Silent Auction Guidelines given to bidders at the show. It would be helpful to also provide the size (in length and width) of a donated quilt. You can optionally set a minimum bid amount for each of your items — you will get an item back at the end of the show if the minimum for it is not met by a bidder.

I will be accepting Silent Auction donations at every QU meeting. If you are unable to bring your item, I am very happy to meet up with you to get your donation.
