President's Message - Camp Women by Janet Taylor, President

We are halfway through 2024, now preparing for Independence Day celebrations and reflections. We will be welcoming Roberta Granville to speak at our July Guild meeting on the Quilt of Valor endeavor in Tallahassee and beyond. Having been touched by war in the armed forces, the Quilt of Valor recipients enjoy a beautiful quilt to honor their service and provide comfort. We're looking forward to Roberta's presentation!

From the book by Nancy K. Loane, Following the Drum: Women at the Valley Forge Encampment¹, I discovered a forgotten assortment of women who spent the winter of 1777-1778 with the Continental Army at Valley Forge, Pennsylvania. These 400 or so hailed from all levels of society, but the ones most unnoticed were poor, often dirty, who worked as washers, cooks, nurses, or seamstresses. Their stories are amazing, heartwarming, and heart-wrenching. They were unbelievably invaluable and vital to survival in that harsh winter's encampment. Another bit of interest I found online was reading General Washington's numerous requests for blankets, blankets, blankets, the very cover needed for warmth and survival during that prolonged war. Recommendation: search out the stories written about the women of Valley Forge!

So what does that have to do with us? We're 247 years away from that winter, drawing closer to the semi quincentennial celebration of the United States, July 4, 2026. How are we related to those "camp women"? Well, we all sew. Had General Washington's blanket request reached us, we would have woven and sewn our hearts out. A camp woman would meet that need. The 1777 girls seemed to have shown up, some with their husbands, or because there was a demand in that "sprawling, noisy, smelly hut city," following a drum. The drum we follow is a humming sewing machine, a hopefully hidden hand-stitch, knowing the object of our work may not know who we are, or why we sew. We follow the same beat that drove the Valley Forge women to give their lives to a cause greater than themselves.

So this year as we remember Tallahassee's 200th birthday, blast fireworks on July 4th, think on a quilt or challenge to complete, let us pay a tribute to the unnamed women who followed the drum of freedom and liberty for a country who reaps from their extraordinary courage.

August Block of the Month - Broken Wheel

Block can be found at:

Broken Wheel (quilterscache.com)

Cut the Fabric:

From Red:

***5 - 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares (one is center of block)

From Blue:

***16 - 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" squares

***4 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles

From White:

***4 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles

Assemble the block:

- 1. Sew on long side, one blue and one white rectangle together. Make 4 units.
- 2. Place on each corner of the red 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" square a blue 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" square, then sew on diagonal. Block should look like a square in a square. Make 4 units.
- 3. Refer to picture above and sew in rows. Block should measure 12 1/2".

I am accepting items at the Guild meeting but if that is not convenient, please feel free to contact me via email at stichnmo@aol.com or by cell at 850-345-1530. I really need you to provide the name of the person who pieced and/or quilted the item including the year completed so I can give credit to the individual(s) when I post the item for viewing. It is important to have the size listed also. We want to be able to get a sense of what the item is worth in materials and labor so if you could provide a minimum bid that would be helpful to me. You will get an item back at the end of the show if the minimum for it is not met by a bidder.

I have a good selection of items but **can always use more** to show off our Guild expertise.

As stated in previous newsletters: Remember the donations can include any sewn or quilted item such as quilts, wall hangings, purses, place mats, table runners, necklaces, ragdolls or such. *PLEASE NOTE: The boutique will be selling cosmetic-size bags, book covers, pet collars and backpacks so keep that in mind as we do not want to compete with the boutique.

As a reminder, the participant who brings in the most money for a single donated item will receive their next year's QU dues (2025) gratis. Please note that the award is for a single entry and does not include the total of an individual's multiple entries. However, we do encourage multiple entries if you so desire.
