
### Philanthropy – Pillowcases for Spinal Cord Unit

QU is making pillowcases for the Spinal Cord Unit. We would like the fabric to be colorful with masculine prints such as fishing, hunting, tractors, animals or anything of that nature.

#### Directions for the Spinal Cord Unit Pillowcases:

- Cut one yard of fabric. Trim off the selvages.
- Place the edges where the selvages had been, together with the right sides of the fabric facing out.
- Sew a quarter inch seam along these long edges and a quarter inch seam along the folded bottom edge.
- Turn the case inside out. Press.
- Along the long edge sew a seam half an inch wide. This will enclose the first seam.
- Sew a half inch wide seam along the bottom of the case, enclosing this seam.
- Turn the case so the right side of the fabric is showing.
- Along the raw edge at the top, fold the edge in toward the wrong side of the fabric and stitch a guarter inch all around the case.
- Then fold the top in four and one half inches, pin in place, and then sew.
- Trim any loose threads and the case is complete.

# LeMoyne Quilt Exhibit 2025 – Interim Report Pam Doffek & Karen Kunz, co-chairs

OK!! The Public LOVED the first week of the show. Many comments at opening reception, Friday and Saturday. "Oh, such beautiful work," "I didn't know we



had quilters of this quality in our community," "What a variety of work" just to quote a few.

There were close to 130 people at the reception (excellent for an opening reception at LeMoyne), including MANY non-QU members and families. This goes to the pull of the allure of all types of quilts produced by our members. Opportunity ticket "donations" looked brisk, thanks to Peggy Clark and Janet Taylor.

QUILTO---what a success story. There were 48 seats available and 46 were filled with many people using 3 cards at a time. The meek took 1 but came back for 2 more before things began. Most people hadn't heard of QUILTO (they learned quickly) and a few had never played BINGO (what tree were they hiding under)? But there were many smiles and positive interactions. Room was left between tables for people to view quilts while playing QUILTO.

Pam spent all day Friday and ½ day Saturday at the Opportunity Quilt donation desk. A modicum of tickets were sold, but the personal interaction and pointing out favorite quilts, as well as urging all visitors to get a bid number for the Silent Auction generated a spirit that just sitting at the table didn't provide. Work on some handwork (even if it's knitting) interact with visitors, be proactive; they love it.

And of course, to all the members who entered quilts. Thank-you for putting yourself and your work "out there." There wasn't a bad comment that I heard. Each and every quilt of every size was amazing and the attendees agreed wholeheartedly.

Please contact me or look at the Clipboard of Opportunity at the next meeting.



#### 2025 Volunteer of the Year Award

It is time to think about nominating an active member of Quilters Unlimited for the Volunteer of the Year Award. This award gives us a chance to say "Thank You" to an active member for generously contributing time and expertise to Quilters Unlimited.



The Entry Form has contact information and three sections to describe the nominee:

- 1. Examples of initiative and/or assuming responsibility & leadership in guild activities
- 2. Willingness to help with routine tasks and unexpected needs
- 3. Examples of encouraging member participation in guild-related, community activities

The Award Criteria below is online in the Policies and Procedures:

- 4. Committee Procedures for Nomination
  - a) The Awards Committee shall solicit nominations from active Quilters Unlimited members through forms, published on the guild's web site.
  - b) There shall be a nominator and a co-nominator and both shall complete and sign the Nomination Form.
  - c) The Awards Committee Chairperson shall not be a nominator or conominator. In the case of any tie votes, the Chairperson shall cast the deciding vote.
  - d) An Awards Committee member, nominated for an award, shall not participate in discussions or voting pertaining to that award.
  - e) The current President is not eligible for the Volunteer of the Year Award.
- 5. Volunteer of the Year Award Criteria.
  - a) The Volunteer of the Year Award will be given to a participating guild member, who: supports the goals and purposes of Quilters Unlimited by promoting knowledge of and interest in quilting and the art of quilting; shows initiative and/or assumes responsibility and leadership; is willing to help with routine tasks and unexpected needs; stimulates participation in guild activities and community-related activities; and gives unselfishly of their time and effort for the benefit of the guild.
  - b) The nominee may also: serve as officer or committee chairperson and demonstrates areas of expertise in guild (programs, writing, other).
  - c) The Volunteer of the Year Nomination Form is due to the Awards Committee Chairperson no later than October 1st of each year. The form is available on the QU website.

The nomination form can be completed and submitted on your computer or on paper. The form must have both a nominator and a co-nominator from the guild. Nomination Forms for the Volunteer of the Year Award are due by October 1.
